Adkins, Douglas D. Dorado: The History of an Ocean Racing Yacht. (Boston 2012). A definitive account of Olin Stephens' breakthrough design which influenced ocean racing during the 1930's, 1940's and 1950's.

Ahari, Zia E. Resolve: Diaries of a Sea Voyage. (2009). The author describes his experiences in a mainly single-handed journey on board his thirty-one-foot sailboat, *Athesa* from Sweden to San Francisco.

Arms, Myron. Cathedral of the World: Sailing Notes for a Blue Planet. (New York, 1999). In these essays, Myron Arms sets out on a series of journeys both physical and spiritual, seeking to explore the ocean experience and to articulate the sailor's age-old quest to understand his world and himself. Climbing the hills of the North Atlantic in a full gale, watching the flight of seabirds, listening to the night-breath of whales, Arms investigates what he calls the "primal spaces" and ponders questions that all such encounters inspire.

Arms, Myron. Riddle of the Ice: a Scientific Adventure into the Arctic. (New York, 1998). Frustrated by an impenetrable barrier of sea ice during his 1991 voyage to northern Labrador, Arms sets out three years later on a voyage to Western Greenland to explain the unsettling anomaly. In the resulting tale, Arms weaves together the unfolding narrative of the voyage itself with a groundbreaking synthesis of the latest theories of Arctic ice production and what they may portend about warming seas and changing patterns of global climate.

Arms, Myron. Servants of the Fish: A Portrait of Newfoundland after the Great Cod Collapse. (Hinesburg, Vermont, 2004). Within the context of his 1998 sailing voyage around the island of Newfoundland, Myron Arms tells the story of the collapse of the northern cod and the end of a way of life for thousands of Newfoundland fishermen. It is a story of loss and dislocation, yet as the voyage evolves, it also becomes a story of heroism, simple kindness, and the distinctly human capacity to survive in the face of seemingly impossible odds.

Baker, Nicholas J. The Artistic Legacy of John Prentiss Benson. (Pocasset, Massachusetts, 2003). A four-volume set that reproduces the images and information catalogued by Benson, the marine artist, in the detailed logs he kept.

Baker, Talbot, Jr. Coaching a High School Sailing Team. (1994). The author has assembled his thoughts on organizing and coaching high school sailing programs as well as on observing other programs. The objective was not to address what to coach, but how to coach. There are chapters on the role of the coach; coaching philosophy; coaching a program with no facilities; coaching a program with facilities; pre-season summary; organizing and running a practice; "skill drills" and ideas for practice; coaching team racing; coaching at a regatta; running a team reaching meet; rules, protests and protest meetings.
